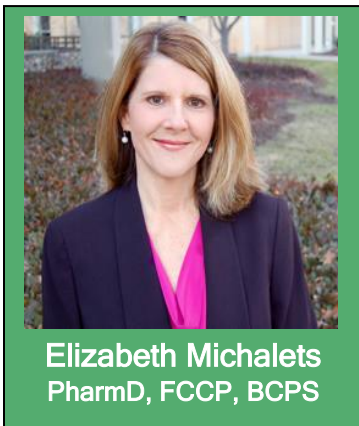

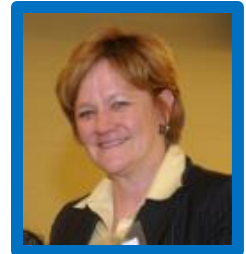

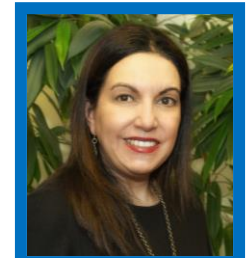

Student & Resident Committee

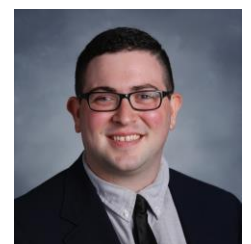
Co-Chairs:

The Student and Resident Committee has had a very productive year in meeting the needs of our Student and Resident PRN members. On May 15, we hosted a webinar on Soft Skills Needed for Health-System Pharmacy Leadership which featured Bob Granko, Stephen Eckel, and Scott Savage presenting on soft skills such as managing your boss, pursuit of continual learning, and emotional intelligence. On August 23, 2018, we hosted a webinar on Hot Topics in Pharmacy Administration, discussing hot topics such as specialty pharmacy, advancing pharmacy technician roles, and drug pricing and availability. In October, we will be hosting our annual HSPA Resident Panel which will be an excellent opportunity for our student and resident members interested in pursuing an HSPA residency to get insight into the process. The ACCP Clinical Administration PRN Education and Research Committee has a goal to address the needs for education, professional development, and research interests of the membership. The committee has focused its efforts on two strategies this year.

First, the committee has been facilitating “roundtable” discussions. These roundtables were meant to bring together PRN members to discuss topics that timely, complex, and where significant challenges exist. Participants join the discussion either because their practice site may be encountering barriers or because they have successes to share. A summary of the roundtables is sent to the membership following the event. In spring 2018, the inaugural roundtable discussion was on drug shortage management. In August 2018, a roundtable was held on adherence to Joint Commission Pain Management accreditation standards. In September 2018, another roundtable is planned on controlled substance regulatory compliance.

Second, Jessie Burch, a member of the committee, has been participating in the multi-PRN authoring of an ACCP primer on personalized medicine. Jessie is addressing implementation strategies.
