Education and Research

For 2019, the Education and Research Committee decided to focus their efforts on understanding the landscape of Pharmacist Continuous Professional Development (CPD). Members completed a literature review, which showed that there are many different ways that institutions are ensuring competency amongst pharmacists. However, there was a lack of process when looking specifically at CPD for clinical pharmacists that did not complete residency, and are looking to maintain and elevate their competence. In order to further understand the barriers that face institutions providing CPD to pharmacists, a survey was sent to the CADM PRN. Results were then analyzed, and will be the basis for the committee's efforts in 2020.
