Other Topics for Discussion	Officer Travel Award Discussion on a proposal that the PRN would provide travel stipends of \$250 annully to each of the three PRN officers to offset the costs to attend the Annual Meeting, and to help encourage volunterism for these positions. This was discussed at last year's business meeting, but the group tabled the discussion and sent it back to the leadership group for further evaluation. At the time, the primary concern cited was the potential cost. The revised proposal differs in the following ways: Decrease to \$250 per officer annually (from \$500 in last year's proposal). Expectation that officers would decline the stipend if they had institutional support. There is an assumption that this will be approximately \$500 annually. If more, then consider shifting a student travel award to an officer travel stipend. There have been few applicants for student travel awards in recent years. There was general support for this idea, so will continue discussion at officer's meeting. Donation to the ACCP Foundation: The Foundation is hurting financially, as it has been challenging to fundraise in the virtual environment. They are requesting a donation from the PRNs. Discussed a donation for \$1000. There was some support for this, but there were also requests to gather more information.	Ideas to be further discussed by leadership	Jennifer/Nitish/Ri ch
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	FIT/MERIT Funding Proposal Discussed a proposal for the committee leadership to select one application to provide partial funding support for the FIT/MERIT program. The funding for the year will be determined by the PRN leadership and will be up to a max of \$1000.00 (program cost \$3750 -\$4750.
